Our specialist logistics will collect your loose IT equipment, palletise and return it for processing. Every asset will then be registered and uniquely bar coded to provide complete traceability. Each asset will be tested and graded and all electronic data will be purged or eradicated to approved government standards to ensure no sensitive data enters the public domain.

Equipment that can be remarketed will be sold via our multi-channel sales team. Released revenue will be distributed on a profit share basis to either offset service charges or provide a return on technology investment. All equipment that cannot be resold/reused will be recycled in accordance with the highest standards of environmental legislation.

Reporting includes asset-level detail to audit standard and transparent analysis of the processing undertaken for each item. Each report will be backed up by a Certificate of Data Eradication and Certificate of Environmental Disposal. All data eradication is backed by £1M of Professional Indemnity Insurance.

Hazardous Waste Directive – July 2005

Essentially replacing the older Special Waste system, the new legislation has two major impacts on businesses with redundant IT equipment. Firstly, it reclassifies CRT monitors as hazardous material for the first time in UK law along with other hazardous IT equipment such as UPS batteries. Secondly, it requires any site that produces more than 200Kgs of such waste product per annum to register with the Environment Agency as a producer of Hazardous Waste. Thereafter the movement and treatment of that material has to be carried out in accordance with strict guidelines.

WEEE Directive - January 2007

The WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) Directive is an EU wide directive designed to make manufacturers and importers (the 'producer') responsible for the cost of disposal of redundant equipment. The Directive sets targets for recovery and recycling across ten categories of products (Category 3 is IT and Telecoms).
